EASY ACCESS

A true gateway to Southern Europe, halfway between Provence and Catalonia, Montpellier enjoys a strategic location in the heart of the Mediterranean arc. Its TGV Saint-Roch station in the city center and Sud de France station near the airport (Paris-Montpellier: 3 hours 15 minutes), its Montpellier Méditerranée international airport (15 minutes from the city center), its motorway access (A9/A7 to Lyon, Marseille, Toulouse, Spain, and Italy, and A75 to Paris), as well as its exceptional public transportation network, make the city easily accessible.

Access by plane

Montpellier Méditerranée Airport is located just 8 km from the city center. It is very easy to reach by direct flight from:

Paris-Montpellier: 1 hour 10 minutes

- Orly: 3 flights per day
- CDG: 5 flights per day

London-Montpellier: 1 hour 45 minutes, between 2 and 3 flights per day

Amsterdam-Montpellier: 1 hour 40 minutes, 1 flight per day (2 on Saturdays)

15 airlines operate direct flights to 13 international destinations and 8 domestic destinations. Montpellier is also easily accessible from Marseille, Lyon, Toulouse, and Béziers airports.

Regular direct flights all year round:

• **Seville-Montpellier:** 2 flights per week (Thursday & Sunday)

• **Rome-Montpellier:** 2 flights per week (Thursday & Sunday)

• **Luxembourg-Montpellier:** 4 flights per week (Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, Sunday)

• **Basel-Mulhouse-Montpellier:** 3 flights per week (Monday, Friday, Sunday)



Airport Shuttle

The shuttle connects Montpellier city center to the airport in 15 minutes.



By car

Montpellier Méditerranée Airport is located 10 minutes from the city center and beaches, at the gateway to the highway network.

Other seasonal direct flights in Europe:

• **Athens-Montpellier:** April to October, 2 flights per week (Tuesday and Saturday)

• **Copenhagen-Montpellier:** March to October, 2 flights per week (Monday and Saturday)

• **Rotterdam-Montpellier:** April to September, 2 flights per week (Monday and Friday)

• **Lisbon-Montpellier:** March to October, 2 flights per week (Friday and Sunday)

• **Zurich-Montpellier:** June to August, 1 hour 30 minutes, 3 flights per week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday)

• **Oslo-Montpellier:** June 22 to August, 2 flights per week (Tuesday and Saturday)

• **Menorca and Mallorca:** seasonal flights

Access by train

Train station Montpellier Saint-Roch



Saint-Roch station is connected by four tram lines and bus lines 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, and 16. It is located in the city center, 200 meters from Place de la Comédie.

Train station Montpellier Sud de France



The second station is located in the heart of the new Cambacérès district. It is served by two bus lines (120 and 106) and direct tramway line 1 at its terminus, "Gare Sud de France." By tramway it takes 20 minutes to travel between the Saint-Roch and Sud de France stations. The aim of this station is to save time on journeys to and from Spain and Belgium, as well as Paris and Lyon. The TGV station is the cornerstone of this new multimodal transport hub, in the Cambacérès district.

AIRPORT/TGV CONNECTIONS

Connection between Charles de Gaulle Airport TGV station and Montpellier:

Direct TGV to Montpellier: 4-hour journey

The SNCF train station at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport is connected to the TGV Sud, TGV Ouest, and TGV Nord networks, as well as the Ouigo, Thalys, and Eurostar main lines.

It also provides easy access to Paris via the RER B.

The Paris-Charles de Gaulle SNCF train station is located in the heart of Terminal 2, between Terminals 2C, 2D, 2E, and 2F.

From Marseille Airport:

Between Marseille Provence Airport (bus station - Platform 5) and Vitrolles-Marseille Provence Airport Station (6 min journey), take the LeBus+13 bus line from the Bus de l'Etang network (7 days a week - 57 return trips daily, 365 days a year, including Sundays and public holidays). Then take the TER train to Montpellier: journey time 1 hour 47 minutes. There are 6 TER trains per day.

Italian destinations to Marseille Airport by direct flight:

Bari, Bologna, Rome, Milan, Cagliari, Catania, Florence, Naples, Olbia, Palermo, Reggio Calabria, Venice

German destinations to Marseille Airport by direct flight:

Berlin, Munich, Frankfurt, Dusseldorf

From Lyon Saint Exupery Airport:

Located just two minutes from the terminals, the TGV station at Lyon Saint-Exupéry Airport offers one direct train per day to Montpellier Saint-Roch (travel time: 1 hour 36 minutes).

It is also possible to reach Lyon Part-Dieu station via the Rhônexpress shuttle (travel time: 30 minutes) and then take a TGV train to Montpellier:

- 1 hour 55 minutes to Montpellier Saint-Roch
- 1 hour 40 minutes to Montpellier Sud de France

Italian destinations to Lyon Airport by direct flight:

Rome, Naples, Venice, Milan, Bari, Cagliari, Catania, Florence, Olbia, Palermo, Comiso

German destinations to Lyon Airport by direct flight:

Berlin, Dusseldorf, Frankfurt, Hamburg, Munich, Nuremberg, Stuttgart

TGV stations for direct trains to Europe

- Barcelona-Montpellier: 3 hours/3 hours 20 minutes depending on the train
- Brussels-Montpellier: 5 hours 50 minutes
- Luxembourg-Montpellier: 7 hours 40 minutes
- Madrid-Montpellier: 6 hours 20 minutes

By car:

- 5 hours from Turin and Genoa
- 6 hours from Milan
- 3 hours 30 minutes from Barcelona

Montpellier's public and eco-friendly transportation system

Montpellier: One of the largest tram networks in France

Montpellier's tramway is the ideal way to get around Montpellier and discover the city from a different angle, on foot or by bike. After being judged the "sexiest tramway in Europe" in 2012 by the New York Times, the Montpellier tramway was voted the most beautiful in France among the twelve major French transport networks according to a survey by the daily newspaper 20 minutes.



Transport in Montpellier Méditerranée Métropole

41 bus lines + 5 tramway lines serving the 31 communes of the metropolis

- **Ligne 1** from Mosson to Gare Sud de France.
- **Ligne 2** from Jacou to Saint Jean de Védas.
- **Ligne 3**, decorated by Christian Lacroix; from Juvignac to Lattes and Pérols (direct access to the sea)
- **Ligne 4**, decorated by Christian Lacroix; around the center
- **Ligne 5**, from Clapiers to Grés de Montpellier

Private transportation

The city of Montpellier is served by the A9/A709 and A75 motorways.

- **North exit (28):** access to the Zoo du Lunaret, hospitals and universities.
- **East exit (29):** access to the historical centre, the Tourist Office of Montpellier Méditerranée Métropole, the congress centre (Corum), the new districts, the Sud de France train station, the Odysseum shopping centre and the Sud de France Arena.
- **Exit West (30):** access to the Rugby and Football stadiums.
- **South exit (31):** access to Montpellier Saint-Roch train station.

For large events, companies can work together to offer as many vehicles as possible.
